#### E. Items to Consider

- Approval of Minutes January 15, 2025, Regular Council Meeting.
   Councilmember Kevin Davis made a motion to approve minutes of January 15, 2025, as presented. Councilmember Bobby Amidon seconded the motion. No discussion, Councilmembers vote in agreement. Motion carries.
- 2. Discuss regulations and enforcement of Village Code Chapter 4 Article 4.08 Outdoor/Exterior Lighting.

Council discussion as regards nonconforming existing lighting changes that do not involve nor require a building permit and reference to lumen levels. New construction and major renovation/remodel compliance can be verified before issuance of Certificate of Occupancy or Certification of Completion. Council instructed staff to request attorney to provide update and options to the outdoor/exterior lighting ordinance for noncompliant existing lighting minor changes

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not involving building permit and reference to lumen levels. Council will revisit this item at the March regular meeting.

3. Discuss and possible determination of traffic bump material and re-installation post road maintenance project completion.

Upcoming road project will require removal of four existing speed bumps. Alpha Paving has quoted \$1,800 to re-install asphalt speed bumps where removed. Council discussion on location and necessity to re-install all four speed bumps. Councilmember Amidon requested Emergency Services be consulted regarding specifications of speed bumps so to not cause delays in response times as they need to slow down considerably when crossing speed bumps. Council will revisit this item at the March regular meeting.

- Discuss development of Village master/strategic plan.
   Council would like to schedule this discussion in workshop format when Council begins future budget workshops.

A quorum was present. Village attorney Caroline Kelley, Hyde Kelley LLP, and Village Engineer Steven Kirkpatrick, Goode Faith Engineering, in attendance.

#### **B.** Council Workshop

Mayor Justin Hamilton led the Council discussions in consideration of

- 1) Zoning Use Summary Table Non-Residential Districts Industrial zoning district. Village currently has no properties zoned as Industrial, inclusion in the Village Comprehensive Plan. Council discussion to consider Conditional Use permitting for Industrial zoning use summary table.
- Zoning Use Summary Table Non-Residential Districts Commercial zoning district. Council discussion to consider adding Golf Cart Rentals & Sales with supplemental regulations to permitted use in Commercial zoning district.
- 3) Zoning ordinance residential districts SF-1 and SF-2 yard requirements. Council discussion to consider amending to lower the required 25' minimum back yard.
- 4) Zoning ordinance residential districts SF-1 and SF-2 yard requirements. Council discussion regarding 45% as maximum lot cover applied to all lots, even the smaller cluster cottage lots. Discussion regarding no adverse effect upon drainage or flooding required drainage study and what information should be required for review before approval.
- 5) Council discussion regarding regulations on commercial signs (including yard signage).

Councilmember Kevin Davis made a motion to adjourn. Mayor ProTem Scott Staeb seconded motion to adjourn. **Mayor Justin Hamilton adjourned the meeting at 7:41 PM.**
